
The outer layer of the Earth is called the crust. It is made up of large tectonic plates which fit together rather like a huge jigsaw. These plates ride on the hotter layer below and are in constant motion, travelling at a few centimetres per year. Volcanoes and earthquakes commonly occur on the edges of the plates.

Cut out the shapes from the map. Fit them together to make the plates of the Earth's crust.
