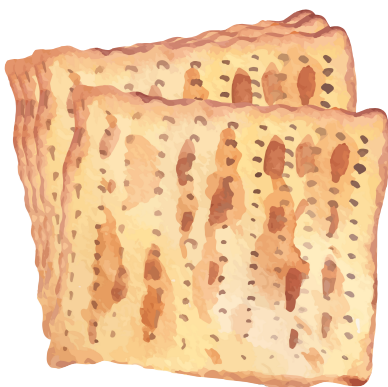
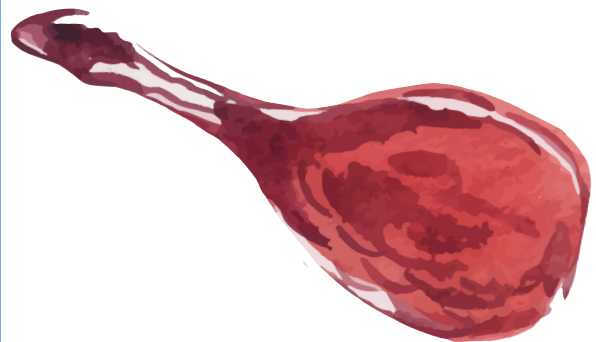
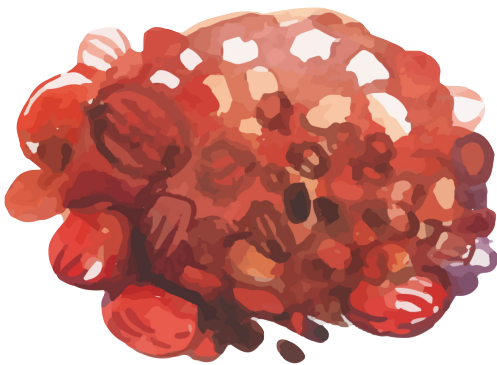

<p>Matza represents the unleavened bread that the Israelites took with them in their hurry to leave Egypt.</p>	<p>Karpas is dipped in salt water and eaten. This represents the tears of the Israelite when they were slaves in Egypt.</p>
<p>Charoset is a paste made of apples, nuts, wine and spices. It symbolises the mortar the slaves had to use to build structures for the Egyptians.</p>	<p>Z'roa is a roasted lamb bone that reminds Jews about the lamb's blood the Israelites painted on their doors as a signal that death should pass over them.</p>
<p>Chazeret is a bitter herb, usually the roots of Romaine lettuce. It symbolises the bitterness of slavery.</p>	<p>Beitzah is a roasted egg. This symbolises the cycle of life, springtime and new life.</p>
<p>Maror is a bitter herb, usually horseradish, that reminds Jews about the bitterness of slavery.</p>
