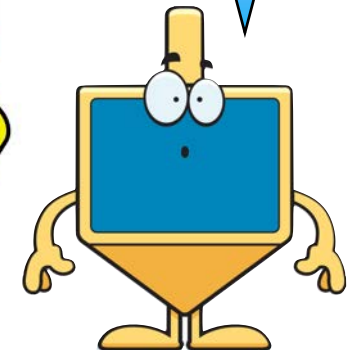
Why do you think Hanukkah is such an important festival?

How to play Dreidel

- 1) Get into pairs or small groups.
- 2) Distribute an even number of pieces to each player, around twenty in total. The pieces can be counters, stickers, sweets or anything else!
- 3) Each player puts one of their tokens in a pot.
- 4) Take it in turns to spin the dreidel. The side it lands on tells you what will do:

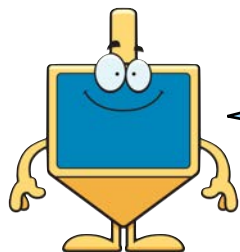
Nun: the player takes nothing

Gimel: The player takes everything in the pot

Hey: the player takes half of what is in the pot

Shin: The player puts a piece into the pot

- 5) Every time the pot is empty, each player puts one of their pieces in.
- 6) Once you have no more pieces, you are out.
- 7) The winner is the player who gains all the pieces!

How to play Dreidel

- 1) Get into pairs or small groups.
- 2) Distribute an even number of pieces to each player, around twenty in total. The pieces can be counters, stickers, sweets or anything else!
- 3) Each player puts one of their tokens in a pot.
- 4) Take it in turns to spin the dreidel. The side it lands on tells you what will do:

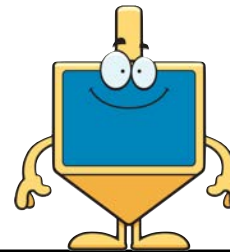
Nun: the player takes nothing

Gimel: The player takes everything in the pot

Hey: the player takes half of what is in the pot

Shin: The player puts a piece into the pot

- 5) Every time the pot is empty, each player puts one of their pieces in.
- 6) Once you have no more pieces, you are out.
- 7) The winner is the player who gains all the pieces!
