Dear Parents and Carers,

I might have heard from your children that we have had a dog visiting us in school this week. These visits have been successful and we have made the decision to appoint the dog to our Chilton team with a view to her becoming a school emotional support dog.

She is still very little and is getting to know the school and adults so for the next few weeks, she will continue to work on learning about her surroundings. Children may be introduced to her briefly around the school offices but she will not have any extensive contact with children until she is ready.

I understand there may be some questions:

What are the benefits of a school dog?

- A calming effect on pupils;
- Improved behaviour and concentration, reduced stress and improved self-esteem;
- Encouraging expression, participation and confidence for all children;
- Fostering a sense of responsibility;
- Motivating pupils to think and to learn, as most children have a high level of natural interest in, enthusiasm for and enjoyment of animals;
- Encouraging respect and thereby improving pupils' relationships with each other, parents and teachers;
- Teaching children to nurture and respect life;
- Helping work undertaken with the most vulnerable children;
- Helping children build confidence in reading;
- Improving attendance;
- Further promote our well-being provision for pupils.

How has the school planned for this?

- A full risk assessment and policy has been written and will be available on the website
- All contact will be carefully planned and children will not be left unsupervised with the dog
- When not working, the dog will be based in one of the school offices

What about allergies?

- All areas of the school are vacuumed and surfaces are wiped down several times daily
- Movement around the school will be controlled
