This policy:

- Clarifies our expectations for our school uniform
- Sets out our approach to requiring a uniform that is of reasonable cost and offers the best value for money for parents and carers
- Explains how we will avoid discrimination in line with our legal duties under the Equality Act 2010

Our Expectations for School Uniform

'Look Smart, Think Smartly'

We expect all pupils to wear full school uniform or their PE kit uniform on their PE day. Uniform to be worn properly (polo shirts and shirts tucked in, collars down etc.)

By choosing Chilton for your child, you commit to follow our school rules and meet our uniform expectations.

Main School Uniform:

Optional School Uniform is highlighted in red

| Item of Clothing | Description |
|--------------------------------|---|
| Trousers | Dark grey |
| Skirt: | Dark grey |
| Dress: | Dark grey Blue and white checked summer dress <i>(usually worn from Term 5 onwards)</i> |
| Shorts / Culottes | Tailored grey shorts / culottes |
| Polo t-shirt, Shirt, or Blouse | White <i>Branded white polo t-shirts are available via the Schoolwear centre</i> |
| Jumper or cardigan: | Navy V-neck jumper, navy cardigan <i>Branded V-neck jumpers and cardigans are available via the Schoolwear Centre</i> |
| Socks or tights | Black, grey, white or navy socks or tights |
| Shoes | Black shoes (no boots, trainers or sandals) <i>For health and safety reasons we do not allow children to wear shoes with platform soles or high heels.</i> In winter, children can wear boots or wellies to school and keep them in their locker. They must wear black shoes in school. |

Additional Chilton branded items are available from the Schoolwear Centre but are all optional.

P.E. Kit Uniform:

Essential:

- Plain White round-necked T-Shirt (non-branded)
- Navy hoodie for winter months (non-branded)
- Navy shorts (non-branded)
- Navy tracksuit bottoms (non-branded)
- Black Plimsolls or non-branded training shoes - not fashion shoes (bare feet for gym or dance)

No jewellery can be worn for PE or swimming.

Hair:

- Long hair should be tied back during the school day (shoulder length+)
- Extreme hairstyles are not appropriate for school. The use of styling products should be kept to a minimum and children should not have decorative patterns cut into their hair or have hair coloured or dyed.
- Hair accessories should be plain and in school uniform colours

Make Up, Jewellery & Accessories:

- Make-up, nail varnish, false nails or temporary tattoos are not allowed in school
- Jewellery - in the interests of safety only stud, sleeper earrings and a small watch may be worn.
- No toys or electrical equipment of any kind should be in school.
- Mobile phones need to be switched off and handed in to the class teacher at the beginning of every day, to be locked away.

We pledge to carefully consider adaptations to our policy on the grounds of equality, by asking pupils' parents / guardians to get in touch with the Head of School, who can answer questions about the policy and respond to any requests on the basis of any protected characteristics.

Expectations for our School Community:

Children who do not adhere to this policy:

- Will be given spare uniform to change into
- Will have a letter sent home
- Will have items confiscated for the day
- Will be asked to remove nail varnish and make up

All staff will closely monitor pupils to make sure they are in correct uniform. In cases where it is suspected that financial hardship has resulted in a pupil not complying with this uniform policy, staff will take a mindful and considerate approach to resolving the situation.

The **Senior Leadership Team** will meet with parents/carers where children are consistently not in the correct uniform.

Parents and carers are expected to make sure their child has the correct school uniform and PE kit, and that every item is:

- Clean and in good condition
- Clearly labelled with the child's name

We request that any parent /carer struggling to meet the cost of our essential uniform get in touch with the Head of School, so that we can swiftly resolve this situation.

Limiting the Cost of School Uniform:

Under new Department for Education statutory guidance for September 2022, our school has a duty to make sure that the uniform we require is affordable. We understand that our branded items cannot be purchased from a wide range of retailers and that requiring many such items limits parents' ability to 'shop around' for a low price.

We ensure our uniform:

- Provides the best value for money for parents/carers
- Has available branded items
- Has unbranded items available as an alternative

We will also ensure that we provide parents and carers with information on our **pre-loved uniform** for sale, which is available for sale via our local [Schoolwear Centre](#).

This **pre-loved uniform** information is available on the [School Uniform](#) website page.

We request that any parent /carer struggling to meet the cost of our essential uniform get in touch with the Head of School, so that we can swiftly resolve this situation.
