Topic Title	Celebration around the world: Diwali and Fireworks Night We will start term 2 with a focus on Diwali. We will learn about the celebration and why it is important to Hindu people. We will also learn about places of worship for Hindu people in our community. Following this, we will learn about fireworks. We will learn about the origins of fireworks night in England, by learning about Guy Fawkes. We will also learn about how fireworks are used in other celebrations around the world.	From here to there During this Topic we will explore modes of Transport and how they are used within our community. We will ride the school minibus to the local harbour to look at the boats and make a note of any other transport we see. We will learn about emergency service vehicles and how they help our community. We will also learn about modes of transport from the past and how transport has changed.	The Icy Winter During the Icy Winter, we will continue to learn about seasonal changes. We will learn about the North and South Pole; exploring how the environment there is different to ours; including the wildlife we see here compared to there. We will learn about changes of state, through melting ice. We will learn how we can help to care for our environment.

Values	This term we will focus on kindness. The theme is ‘In a world where you can be anything, be kind’. We will focus on being kind to ourselves and exploring ways in which we can look after ourselves mentally and physically. We will revisit the use of our zen dens, adding in new breathing techniques to regulate our emotions. The children will also be starting to learn about healthy relationships. They will learn what a friend is and what makes a good friend. We will explore unkindness and falling out with friends, how this makes us feel and what we can do when this happens.		
Cultural capital	Cultural knowledge: The children will be learning about Hinduism and the celebration of Diwali. They will compare this to the celebrations they have experienced in their own lives and look at differences and similarities between these. They will also learn about historic events from the past in learning about the origins of fireworks night. The children will begin to learn about climate change, the impact on the polar ice caps and how we can help. Cultural experiences: A local trip on our mini-bus to see our local harbour.

During this the children will be immersed in the celebration of Diwali and Bonfire Night through non-fiction texts, stories and videos. They will learn lots of new words and be given opportunities to use them throughout the week. During circle times, they will describe their own celebrations they have experienced and look at the similarities and differences between these and Diwali.</p> <p>During transport, when learning about the book 'Naughty Bus', we will be thinking about how the 'Naughty Bus' behaves. We will be expressing our points of view about whether the Naughty Bus made the right or wrong choices. We will also be going on a short trip to the Harbour. We will be describing and retelling this event in detail.</p> <p>During our short topic about Icy Winter, we will be exploring a range of books, poems and rhymes about seasons and winter. We will learn the meaning of new words such as seasons and hibernation and apply this throughout the day.</p>

During this time the children will be introduced to ideas such as a contents page, headings and labels. From term 2, in RWI, children will be taught in small groups. They will continue to learn to recognise and form their set 1 sounds. We will continue to teach the children to blend and segment sounds in order to be able to read and write simple regular words. The children will begin to learn some irregular 'red words' (e.g. the, my, I).

OR triangle, square, triangle, square....). They will learn to identify the part of the pattern that repeats, have a go at continuing the pattern and then create their own AB repeating pattern. Children will also learn to identify errors in a repeating pattern.</p> <p>Children will learn about numbers to 5. They will learn how to represent these numbers on their fingers and will learn to recognise these numbers. The children will link the written numbers to amounts of objects. They will then progress to do this with numbers to 10.</p> <p>Children will then learn how to find one more and one less than a given number. They will use practical resources to do this and then link it to a number line.</p> <p>Children will learn to describe 2D shapes using informal language and will develop their understanding of 2D and 3D shapes through construction (building tasks). We will learn to select, rotate and manipulate these shapes so that we can use them appropriately.</p> <p>Towards the end of term, the children will learn to compare height and length of objects using words such as taller, shorter and longer.</p>

They will be collecting and exploring materials that show us signs of the changing seasons.
